



Consultation on the Federation of Newington Green and Rotherfield Primary Schools- Report to the Governing Board.

January 2022

Background

The consultation ran from 15th November 2021 to the 7th January 2022 for both schools.

From 15th November 2021, pages were set up on both school websites with the consultation document and dates of meetings parents could attend. An electronic link was set up so that stakeholders could respond via an e form. The consultation information was in both school newsletters for the entirety of the consultation period.

On the 10th January 2022, the electronic forms were closed and it was found that there were no responses for either school. The consultation was extended until midnight on the 12th January 2022 and text/email sent to all parents and staff about new extension date.

Summary of responses

The majority of respondents to the consultation for the federation of Newington Green and Rotherfield agreed with the proposal. Rotherfield had 17/18 responses in favour (98%), as 'not sure' responses were test emails. Newington Green had 20/33 in favour (61%).

The Newington Green response was more mixed from parents, and the Governing Body will need to give further detailed consideration to some of the issues and questions raised.

Governors should be mindful that the consultation does not serve as a determinative vote; rather, it serves as a process which supports governing bodies in making an informed decision regarding whether to proceed with federation, and whether to make modifications to the original proposal.

There are a number of common themes emerging across many responses, raising matters which the governing bodies of the respective schools may wish to consider as part of their decision-making process. It may be advisable for the governing bodies, whether or not they decide to proceed with federation, to ensure that their final decision addresses these issues, including:

- Ensuring that that the size and composition of the governing board balances the need for representation, diversity and efficient decision making;
- Board accountability and how the recruitment process for governors will work;
- Effective and ongoing communication about the work of the board, with clear information about the decisions reached available to parents and staff;
- Confirming that federation is not a precursor to academisation;
- How to ensure that both schools would benefit from federation;
- Whether differences in Ofsted grades or pupil rolls might potentially affect resource allocation between the schools or mean senior leaders' time is diverted to address imbalances or weaknesses in one school at the expense of the other;

- Whether federation could be reversed in the future if the situation changed; and
- Whether anticipated cost savings would mean an increase in staff workload or affect the personalised support available for children?

Outcomes of meetings and discussions are recorded in the Annex below for each school. A summary of the electronic form response is also provided below for each school.
